PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that any qualified elector of an Oscoda County Township; who are not already registered, may register to vote at the office of the Township; the Office of the County Clerk; a Secretary of State branch office, or other designated state agency. Registration forms can be obtained at www.mi.gov/vote and mailed to the Township Clerk. Voters who are already registered may update their registration at www.expressSOS.com.

The last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk is **Monday, October 19, 2026**. After this date, anyone who qualifies as an elector may register to vote in person with proof of residency (MCL 168.492) at the following:

State Proposals:

Proposal 2026-1

A proposal to convene a constitutional convention for the purpose of drafting a general revision of the state constitution

Shall a convention of elected delegates be convened in 2027 to draft a general revision of the State Constitution for presentation to the state's voters for their approval or rejection?

Proposal 2026-2

A proposed initiated law to prohibit campaign contributions from certain regulated utilities and government contractors and apply campaign finance laws and regulations to additional types of political communications

The proposal would:

- Prohibit regulated electric and gas utilities, contractors with over \$250,000 annually in government contracts, and people and organizations with substantial connections to these utilities/contractors from making direct or indirect campaign contributions to those who run for or hold offices that impact them.
 - Expand laws regulating spending on political communications, including those requiring disclosing donor information, to apply to communications clearly identifying candidates or ballot questions, even if they do not expressly advocate voting for/against them.
 - Expressly apply the law requiring disclosure of who paid for political communications to internet political communications.
- Should this proposal be adopted?

County Proposals:

The Oscoda County Sheriff Equipment Ballot

This millage represents authorization to levy .33 mills for four years, 2026-2029, for costs of operating the Oscoda County Sheriff's Department, replacing previous authorization of .25 mills for such operating expenses, which expires with the 2029 levy.

Shall the limitation upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed upon real and tangible personal property in any one (1) year under the Michigan Constitution be increased in the County of Oscoda, Michigan by .33 mills (which is equal to \$.33 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value of all such property) for a period of four (4) years, 2026 through 2029 inclusive, for the purpose of acquiring, maintaining, and operating vehicles, equipment and inventory for the use by the Oscoda County Sheriff's Department? The amount of revenue the county will collect if the millage is approved and levied by the county in the first year is estimated to be \$179,310.83. The proposed millage is a new additional millage, the revenue from which would be disbursed to the County of Oscoda.

Township Proposals:

BIG CREEK TOWNSHIP ROAD MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT PROPOSAL

Shall the tax limitation on general ad valorem taxed within the Township of Big Creek imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution be increased for said Township by 1.0 mills (\$1.00 per \$1000 of taxable value) for the period of 2026 through 2035 inclusive for the purpose of road maintenance, improvements including pedestrian travel and lighting: and shall the township levy such increase in millage for said purpose, thereby raising in the first year and estimated \$168,365.

School Proposals:

MIO AUSABLE SCHOOLS SINKING FUND MILLAGE PROPOSAL

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Mio AuSable Schools, Oscoda County, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy not to exceed 1 mill (\$1.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 years, 2027 to 2031, inclusive, to create a sinking fund for the purchase of real estate for sites for and the construction or repair of school buildings; for school security improvements; for the acquisition or upgrading of technology; for the acquisition of student transportation vehicles; for the acquisition of parts, supplies, and equipment used for the maintenance of student transportation vehicles; for the acquisition of eligible trucks and vans used to carry parts, equipment, and personnel for or in the maintenance of school buildings; for the acquisition of parts, supplies, and equipment used to maintain such trucks and vans; and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2027 is approximately \$323,880 (this replaces millage that expired with the 2026 tax levy)?

WEST BRANCH-ROSE CITY AREA SCHOOLS OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in West Branch-Rose City Area Schools, Ogemaw, Gladwin and Oscoda Counties, Michigan, be increased by 5 mills (\$5.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 9 years, 2026 to 2034, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 1.0515 mills are levied in 2026 is approximately \$541,898 (this millage is to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963 and will be levied only to the extent necessary to restore that reduction)?

Cheboygan-Otsego-Presque Isle Educational Service District Special Education Millage Renewal Proposal

This proposal will permit the intermediate school district to continue to levy special education millage previously approved by the electors.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 0.6231 mill (\$0.6231 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Cheboygan Otsego-Presque Isle Educational Service District, Michigan, to provide funds for the education of students with a disability, be renewed for a period of 6 years, 2027 to 2032, inclusive; the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2027 is approximately \$2,992,734 from local property taxes authorized herein (this is a renewal of millage that expire with the 2026 tax levy)?

District Library Proposal:

Library Millage Renewal Proposal

Shall the Oscoda County District Library, County of Oscoda, State of Michigan, be authorized to levy a millage annually in an amount not to exceed .4883 mill (\$0.4883 per each \$1,000 of taxable value), which is a renewal of the previously authorized millage rate that expired in 2025, against all taxable property within the Oscoda County District Library district for a period of four (4) years, 2026 through 2029, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for all district library purposes authorized by law? The estimate of the revenue the Oscoda County District Library will collect in the first year of levy (2026) if the millage is approved and levied by the Library is approximately \$270,000.
